

Travel Authorization for F1 and J1 Visa Holders

F-1 and J1 students are allowed to travel during Summer and semester breaks (including spring break, fall break, and holidays). The Office of International Affairs will not approve travel for students during the semester unless it meets the criteria for emergency travel. Please note that there mayobbetry specific travel restrictions in effe worldwide and in some places routine U.S. visa services have been suspended or delayed. Students who ar switching programs or transferring to another school do not require travel authorizations and will enter the U.S. with their new I-20If your visa is expired, delay travel until you have booked an appointment with enough time to renew your visa. Please note that airliners und the world frequently cancel flights. - x be unable to keep your assistantship (Graduate students cannot hold assistantships while outside) the
- x be unable to keep scholarships and/or-oampuæmployment
- x be unable to complete your degreeogram
- x lose a semester of eligibility for OPT and CAPT
- x owe rent even that you may be legally bound to
- x be required to reapply for admission-Students who skip amajor term (Springer Fall), are required to apply for readmission
